Sabbath is important in the life of the church and in our personal lives. The invitation to rest is a gift from God and it is both an invitation and command. Scripture reminds us that Sabbath is the blessed time set apart which is holy "because on it God rested from all God's work which God had done in creation." (Genesis 2:3)



Sabbath, however, is not simply rest. At its root, taking Sabbath invites us to pause from our own day-to-day frenetic schedules and our self-sufficiency and see the wondrous works of God in the world. Sabbath invites us to draw nearer to our neighbors, ourselves, and God. Sabbath invites us to stop what we are doing and see what God is doing. As Walter Brueggemann shares, "Sabbath is not simply the pause that refreshes. It is the pause that transforms."

It is not surprising that the liturgical season that stretches through summer is what we call Ordinary Time, signified by the color green. It is also called growing time; it's a time to grow in our faith through our worship, service, and prayer. In this Sabbath season, in this growing time, how are you pausing to see what God is up to? What are you doing to listen more closely to how God is speaking? What can you do to open your eyes to God's work? Together let us lean into this Sabbath season and see how you and Covenant might be transformed!



Here are four of my favorites that we practice:



Replacing light bulbs with LED lights saves loads of energy and hundreds of dollars over the long lifespan (up to 10 years) of these lights.

Ditching bottled water greatly reduces plastic use and trips to the store. Often no better than tap water, the cost of bottled water adds up and has up to 3500 times the



environmental impact of tap water! Using a faucet or refrigerator water filter and a reusable water bottle saves money and helps the planet.



Buying clothes (and more) secondhand saves you money and reduces things going to landfills. Thanks to countless websites (Ebay, Etsy, Poshmark, etc.) and second-

hand/consignment stores, you can buy almost anything in great shape and at great savings!

Joining a credit union can help our Earth. Large banks invest your money in fossil fuels, coal, industrial farming, and other environmentally harmful industries. However, credit unions must invest your money right in your local community. They also save you on fees, and often have the best interest rates.


