Music Notes from Ronn Lowe: Raymond Weidner, an American choral conductor, organist, and composer, was born in Philadelphia and grew up in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. He began piano lessons age 6 and organ at 14, studying under David Ulrich of Philadelphia. At 16 he performed on the famous Wanamaker organ in Philadelphia, and during his high school years, he studied with Reginald Lunt in Lancaster, having won the chapter's Young Artist's Competition in 1969. Raymond Weidner has taught composition at Lynchburg College and Sweet Briar College and is currently Director of Music at First Presbyterian Church, Lynchburg. His personal interests include drawing, painting, building furniture, and classic British sports cars. He and his wife Margie, a singer and professional music teacher, have two adult sons.
