Music Notes from Ronn Lowe: "Solid Rock" is an amazing arrangement for organ by composer Craig Phillips. The beginning sounds in the pedal are followed by melody and fanfare, and then the middle section is very quiet, building yet again to fanfares and full organ at the end! I love this powerful statement: "On Christ the Solid Rock I Stand, on Other Ground is Sinking Sand." "For All the Saints" is a traditional Christian hymn that describes the common life of all the saints celebrating their communion in heaven and on earth. Fugato means fugue: a contrapuntal compositional technique in two or more voices, built on a subject (theme) that is introduced at the beginning in imitation (repetition at different pitches) and recurs frequently in the course of the composition. You will hear the opening theme repeated in right hand, left hand, and the pedals.
