In many hymn books you will find multiple different hymn titles to this tune for the Christmas Season, Epiphany, and Easter. "Psalm 19 The Heavens Declare" is a popular piece often used for weddings as a recessional. "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands."
