Music Notes from Ronn Lowe: One of the hymns we are singing today is "Jesus, Lover of My Soul" with the hymn tune "Aberystwyth." It is another one of those hymn tunes that has a strange looking name, but it was actually named after the seaside resort in Wales where Joseph Parry composed this hymn in 1876. It is in a minor key, which is often associated with pieces sung or played in Lent. Our postlude today is a stirring arrangement of this hymn as well, arranged by Ashley Grote. Born in Essex, England in 1982, he became Master of Music at Norwich Cathedral in 2012. (Master of Music in England is often referred to as Director of Music in this country.) Before starting his position at Norwich Cathedral, Ashley was Assistant Organist at Westminster Abbey and Gloucester Cathedral.
